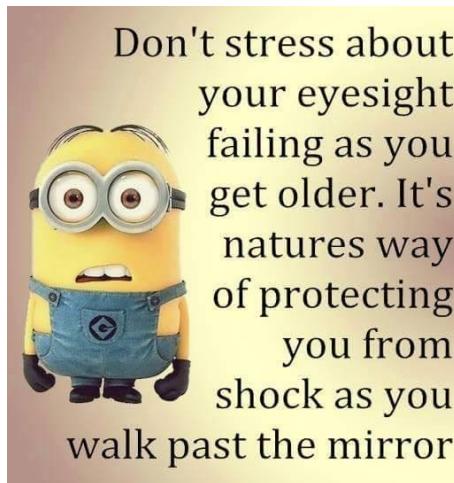
### Rodney Dangerfield Stand Up Jokes

### New “Viagra” Pill for Women approved by FDA

The first prescription drug to enhance women’s sexual drive won regulatory approval recently, clinching a victory for a lobbying campaign that had accused the Food and Drug Administration of gender bias for ignoring the sexual needs of women.

The drug — Addyi, is actually the first drug approved to treat a flagging or absent libido for either sex. “This is the biggest breakthrough for women’s sexual health since the pill,” said Sally Greenberg, executive director of the National Consumers League.

The pill can be prescribed or dispensed only by doctors and pharmacists who watch an online slide presentation and pass a test of their comprehension. Women are advised to stop using the drug if they see no effect after eight weeks.
